Get ready – Get set – GO!

Mark your calendar – April 5th until ?

Shop until you drop! It's time for the Patton House semi-annual THRIFT – Dollar-a-bag SALE! Featuring all "THRIFT" clothing and accessories.

Jewelry NOT included in sale. We supply the bags; you fill them up! Hours: Monday through Saturday; 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday 1 – 4 p.m. Be sure and tell your; family, friends, neighbors and others. Shop early as inventory goes quickly.

Jewelry galore! There's been a change in how we have our jewelry available for purchasing; Jewelry is now in labeled storage boxes, except for necklaces, they are in a large square basket on the table near the front desk. The storage boxes are on the lower self of the same table where the necklaces are located, and on the side shelves of the front desk. The jewelry is sorted by type: Necklaces, bracelets, rings, clip earrings, post/wired earrings, watches, etc. This will make it easier for our customers to quickly find what they are

interested in. The jewelry is kept near the front desk to avoid theft. When you consider that most of the jewelry is priced between \$3.00 to \$6.00, selling just a few items adds up to a sizeable amount, and because our prices are very affordable, we sell a lot of jewelry.

Living in Thousand Oaks, my husband Terry and I traveled through Springville to camp, hike, and backpack in the Sierra. We have great memories of Camping at Quaking Aspen. In the early 80's we began looking to buy a cabin in the local mountains. We bought a small cabin in Sequoia Crest and in the summer of 1984 began spending our July and August at the Crest.

Both of us were teachers, which made this possible. Those summers were

some of the most tranquil times of our lives.

Every couple of weeks we drove down the mountain to shop for groceries. During those times we got to know Springville and the surrounding communities. We thought about moving to the area when we retired. We bought 40 acres (gulp!) in 1987. We decided to look for teaching jobs in the area. In the fall of 1989 I began teaching math to 7 and 8 graders in Terra Bella and my husband began teaching English at Porterville High School.

In the summer of 1989 we built a barn with living quarters upstairs on our 40 acres. We lived in the barn for two and a half years until our Thousand Oaks home sold and Dennis Corzine built us a beautiful home.

In the mid-90s we purchased Barb's Best Apple Cider Syrup from Barbara and Larry Otter. We ultimately changed the name to Cider house Foods as we added apple butter and granola. We produced the items in our upstairs barn kitchen. We sold the business to Chad and Kelly Hansen after 12 years when we were ready to really retire.

I retired from teaching in 2003 after 35 years teaching high school Home Economics and middle school Math. I met ladies in the Community Club and I joined in 2004. I have been the Publicity Chair for a number of years and was the Patton House Volunteer Coordinator for five years.
